Assessing, Promoting and Educating

- The Porter County Substance Abuse Council is dedicated to reducing the incidence of substance abuse in Porter County.
- We are working to reduce youth and adult substance abuse by assessing for, promoting through and educating about community-based programs.
- We formulate and implement a county-wide comprehensive plan to advocate legislative concerns both locally and state-wide.
- We receive funding from monies collected from Porter County DUI convictions and drug interdictions. These monies are distributed to member-grantees in treatment, law enforcement and prevention programs. We encourage members to apply for a grant and become part of the solution. In addition, federal funding for a 5 year grant was received from SAMHSA and the Office of National Drug Control Policy. Our administrative expenditures are 25% or less than the total revenues.
- The Council meets the 2nd Thursday of each month.
- The Drunk Driving Task Force Meets the 3rd Thursday of each month.
- Meetings are open to public.

MISSION & GOALS

Reduce youth and adult substance abuse by assessing the extent of the problem, promoting and implementing effective community based programs, and educating the community on substance abuse issues and solutions.



PROBLEM STATEMENTS

Problem Statement 1

Porter County experiences a high incidence of transportation, availability, accessibility and abuse of illegal substances, controlled substances and mind-altering substances. Crimes associated with supporting substances. Crimes associated with supporting substance abuse habits have increased.

Problem Statement 2

Porter County has a higher percentage of adolescent and adult substance abuse than other counties in Indiana. This behavior often begins during grade, middle and high school years. Porter County has insufficient cost-effective treatment alternative and/or services available to provide a recovery-oriented option for treatment and rehabilitation of individuals who use, abuse or are dependent upon substances.

Problem Statement 3

In Porter County the average age of first use of a gateway drug is 12 to 14 years old. Students are reporting higher than state average use of marijuana, alcohol, binge drinking, and prescription medication.

Problem Statement 4

A lack of collaboration hinders efforts to fight substance abuse in Porter Co.

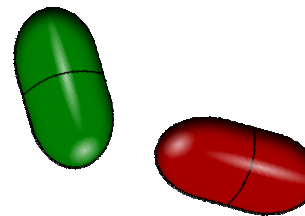

PROMOTING PARENTAL AWARENESS DRUG KITS AVAILABLE

The Council provides drug testing kits to parents that would like to take the first step in confirming their child may have used or deterring their child from using one of the following drugs: marijuana, heroin, cocaine, benzodiazepine, amphetamines and/or methamphetamines. Characteristics of Substance Abuse

- Drop in grades
- Mood swings
- Change of friends
- Borrowing of money
- Use of candles or incense
- Seeds in pockets of clothing
- Loss of interest in goals
- Slurred speech
- Weight loss
- Wearing of sunglasses
- Loss of personal possessions
- Constant cough
- Difficulty in concentrating

THE ANTI-DRUGS

REDUCE OR ELIMINATE VIDEO GAMING and encourage physical sporting activities such as: baseball, soccer, hockey, track, basketball, football, swimming and any other individual or team sports.

ENCOURAGE THE OUTDOORS: Hiking, fishing, camping, geocaching, Indiana Dunes adventures

ENCOURAGE THE FAMILY: Camping, golf, Indiana Dunes adventures, kayaking, boating, volunteer

INCLUDE FRIENDS: Gives you an opportunity to meet the friend, their parent and see where your child is hanging out.

ENCOURAGE APPRECIATION FOR THE ARTS: Introduce a musical instrument, join the marching band (this is a full time commitment), journalism newspaper/yearbook, try out for a play; Drawing, painting, sculpting;
